Citizenship Washington Focus

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) is a leadership and civic engagement program conducted by the National 4-H Council for high school age youth. The program is run for six consecutive weeks during the summer months and New Jersey typically attends the second full week of July. It is held at the Hyatt Regency in Bethesda, Maryland just outside Washington, DC. Using Washington, DC as a working classroom, delegates learn about the government, citizenship, and civic education.

New Jersey 4-H sends 20-30 4-H members and 2-3 adult advisors to Citizenship Washington Focus each year. The learning takes place through energetic workshops, appropriate field trips (including visits with congressional representatives) and fun social events.

There are approximately 200-250 4-H members representing different states at the 4-H center during the week of CWF. The cost for the week is approximately \$1400, which includes registration, lodging, transportation, all activities, and most meals. There are local scholarships available to participants through their county 4-H program. Participants may only attend this event one time during their 4-H career. All interested 4-H members must be in grades 9-12 at the time of the application and must go through a local selection process. Further information about attending as a New Jersey delegate will be sent to eligible members when it becomes available. Applications are usually due in late December for the conference in July.

November PhotoCorps Theme


The NJ 4-H PhotoCorps is open to youth in grades 4-13.







Information About Your Involvement in the 4-H Program

You may want to save this page and refer to it if you have any questions about the basic requirements for membership.

Yearly 4-H Requirements for Standard Club Members (Grades 4-13)

Listed below are the requirements all members must meet in order to complete the 4-H year.

Project Completion

To complete a project, the member must complete the requirements as listed for the project, including completing a record book and having a project judged.

Year Completion

To complete a 4-H year a member must:

- complete a least one project
- attend 70% of club meetings
- do a club or county presentation
- participate in a 4-H sponsored community service project at club, county, regional or state level
- participate in club activities

<u>Fair Premium</u>

To receive a fair premium, a member must complete his or her project and display it at the fair. They must also complete the 4-H year.

County Award Eligibility

To receive a county award: *First and second year members must:*

- complete the 4-H year including completing their project,
- do a public presentation at least at the club level. (Only members doing a public presentation at the county level will be considered for a medal or citation. 4-H members giving a public presentation only at the club level will be considered for certificates.)
- participate in some county events such as the Fair, Holiday Crafts, etc.

Third year and older members must:

- complete the 4-H year including completing their project,
- do a public presentation at the county level. (Only members doing a public presentation at the county level will be considered for a certificate, medal or citation.)
- participate in some county events such as the Fair, Holiday Crafts, etc.
